City Manager Duncan stated that the city has relied on MyGov Hub for utility online payments through Paymentus. Instead of Paymentus, payments will be processed

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through Clover Connect beginning April 1<sup>st</sup>. There will be no visible changes to the front end users.

Finance Director Denny reported that the financials in the council packet were for the month ending 01/31/2022. Property taxes are still coming in and the city just received a check for two million dollars in tax revenue. The enterprise fund is in good shape.

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- Roman's All Star Cafe  
Councilmember Ramsey made a motion to approve the Roman's All Star Café agreement, which was seconded by Councilmember Brewer. The motion passed.

### 11.5 Discussions

- City Entrance Signs  
Councilmember Brewer made a motion approve the type C sign, which is the single sign on a pole with a stone base, for the tertiary entrance signs, which was seconded by Councilmember Hickey. The motion passed.  
Councilmember Harrold voted in opposition.

Councilmember Brewer made a motion approve the design style 3 sign in type B locations and add the word Historic to the sign for the secondary entrance signs, which was seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Brown. The motion passed.

Councilmember Hickey made a motion approve the style 1 type A sign that says Welcome to Historic York and is 18 feet in length, for the main entrance sign, which was seconded by Councilmember Ramsey. The motion passed.

- Police Vehicle Replacement  
Councilmember Ramsey made a motion to use the fund balance from the general fund to cover the remaining balance on replacement of the damaged police vehicle which was seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Ed Brown. The motion passed


### 12. Mayor's Report
